परिचय

जलवायु परिवर्तन आज के समय में एक महत्वपूर्ण समस्या बन चुका है। यह पृथ्वी के वातावरण में दीर्घकालिक परिवर्तन को दर्शाता है, जो प्राकृतिक और मानवीय गतिविधियों के कारण उत्पन्न होता है।

जलवायु परिवर्तन के कारण :

- 1) **मानवीय गतिविधियाँ** - औद्योगीकरण, वाहनों से निकलने वाला धुआँ, वनों की कटाई और जीवाश्म ईंधन का अत्यधिक उपयोग।
- 2). **प्राकृतिक कारण** - ज्वालामुखी विस्फोट, सौर विकिरण में परिवर्तन और महासागरों की धाराओं में बदलाव

जलवायु परिवर्तन के प्रभाव :

1. **ग्लोबल वार्मिंग** - पृथ्वी का तापमान बढ़ रहा है, जिससे बर्फ पिघल रही है और समुद्र का स्तर बढ़ रहा है।
2. **अत्यधिक मौसम परिवर्तन** - कहीं अत्यधिक गर्मी, कहीं बाढ़ तो कहीं सूखा जैसी समस्याएँ उत्पन्न हो रही हैं।
3. **वन्यजीवों पर प्रभाव** - कई जीवों की प्रजातियाँ विलुप्त होने के कगार पर हैं।

समाधान :

1. **हरित ऊर्जा का उपयोग** - सौर और पवन ऊर्जा को बढ़ावा देना।
2. **वृक्षारोपण** - अधिक से अधिक पौधे लगाना और वनों की रक्षा करना।
3. **कार्बन उत्सर्जन में कमी** - वाहनों और उद्योगों से निकलने वाले प्रदूषण को नियंत्रित करना।

निष्कर्ष:

जलवायु परिवर्तन से निपटने के लिए हमें व्यक्तिगत और सामूहिक

स्तर पर प्रयास करने होंगे। यदि हम अभी कदम नहीं उठाते, तो भविष्य में

इसके गंभीर परिणाम भुगतने पड़ सकते हैं।



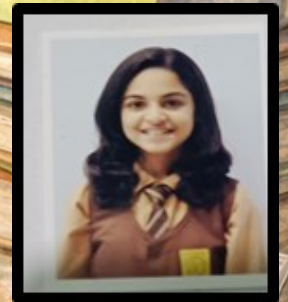
